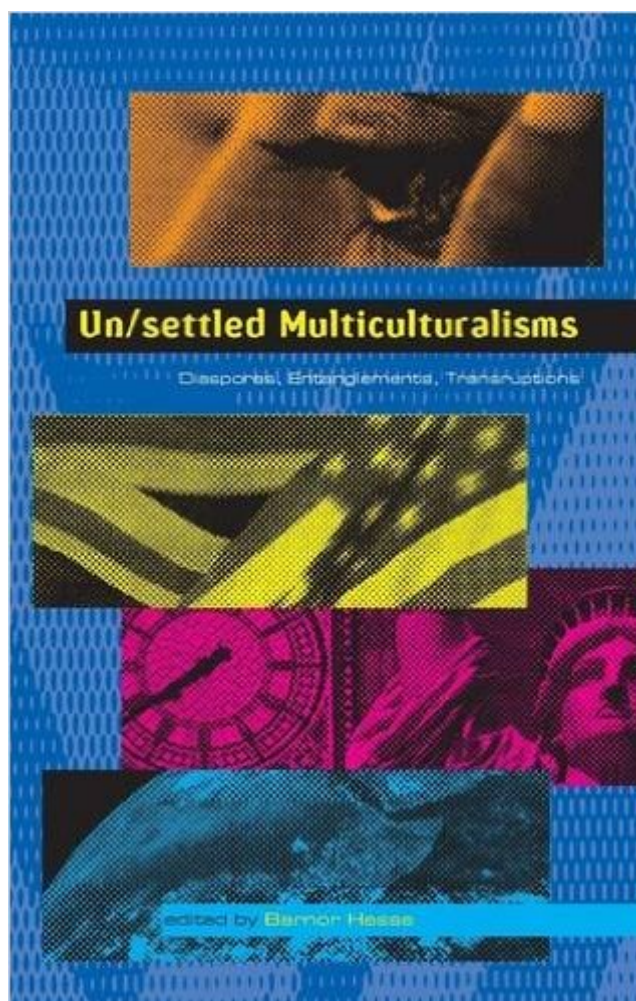


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Un/settled Multiculturalisms: Diasporas, Entanglements, Transruptions



Synopsis

This anthology reconsiders the meanings of multiculturalism in the West. In introducing a new conceptual language, the volume stresses the importance of distinguishing between the multicultural as a signifier of the unsettled meanings of cultural differences, and multiculturalism as the signified of attempts to âœfixâ • their meaning in national imaginaries. The book also casts the debates about multiculturalism in the contexts of globalization, post-colonialism, and what Barnor Hesse calls âœmulticultural transruptionsâ •--which he sees as resurgent, irrepressible multicultural issues.
