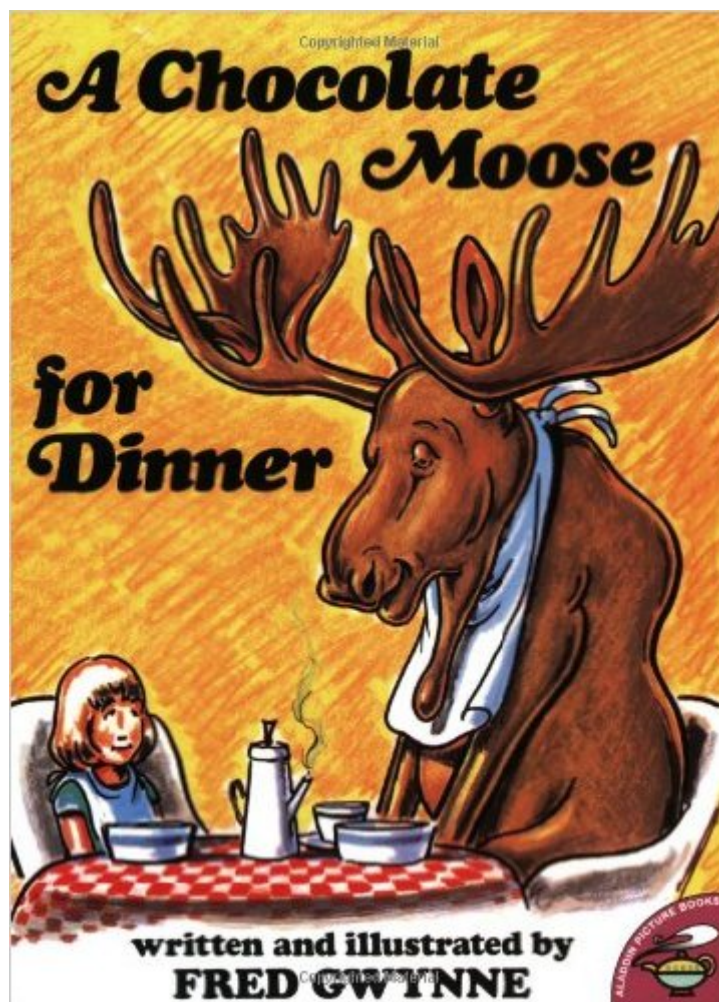

The English language is all [messed] up. Foreigners recognize that immediately, but it takes we Americans much longer to realize that. Of course, with all the goofy rules and exceptions in English, it can be quite fun to speak it. context can help children gain an appreciation for language. With that in mind, A CHOCOLATE MOOSE FOR DINNER is a delightful book. The sayings and the illustrations that accompany those phrases are a joy to read and usually get several laughs from children. A few of the phrases (shoe tree, and the rowing allusions) maybe a bit unfamiliar to modern audiences. Nevertheless, those terms add to the book rather than detract. Children love this book and it is sure to be a winner in almost any home.

I took a graduate class this summer in which we had a guest speaker who taught first grade. She was explaining something new in education called "Edible Education." She first read this book to our class of adults. She held our attention as if we were little ones. Then we had some real chocolate mousse. I'm a teacher of French and will use this book to show students how odd our own language is. Then we'll have some real chocolate mousse. I truly adore this book and know that it will be a favorite for my children some day.

I love this book. I am a kindergarten teacher. The students in my class wanted me to read this book over and over again. I recommend this book to classroom teachers and moms. It is a funny story and the illustrations are amazing! I found it funny that "Herman Munster", Fred Gwynne wrote this story.

Beware if you are looking for an educational book on idioms. This book illustrates a "chocolate moose" but never explains the mousse. It shows a "Man on the Lamb" but never explains lam. It illustrates an amusing picture of "undertoe" but fails to explain undertow. You may want to buy the book and complete each page with the accurate description like I did!

This and it's companion, "The King Who Rained", are my favorite children's books. Unlike most children's books, which are really boring for adults. Grown-ups definitely get a kick out of this. Even though he can't read yet, my 18-month old grandnephew really enjoyed the pictures, while his father was laughing out loud reading it.

I purchased this book and The King Who Rained together. I first bought them when my children were very young and they came out. I keep a library of good children's books on hand for all my grandchildren to read and to borrow, since I do not use a television, and my grandchildren do not have television either.
